Minutes

The minutes from October 2018 were reviewed and approved. The minutes from the Severe Maternal Mortality's planning meeting were also reviewed and approved.

Agenda Items

Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) Update

- IDPH gave an update on the progress of the collaborative improvement and innovation network group focused on lead exposure. The group is doing surveys at higher risk counties in Illinois.
- IDPH also discussed a project/survey for child care at delivery.
 - Trying to quantify the problem to figure out how allocate resources.
 - Sometimes children are unsupervised or with hospital staff.
 - Want to compile a list of best practices or recommendations that a facility could consider implementing to help.
- IDPH also gave an update on the maternal mortality report.
 - IDPH plans to implement a grand rounds of the report.
 - Any ideas for dissemination are welcome.

Severe Maternal Morbidity (SMM) Review Committee

- Stephen Locher, Stacie Geller, and Abby Koch gave an update on the SMM and plans for the review committee. Want to create a group that looks at severe maternal morbidities and have a case review much like the maternal mortality review committees.
- Discussed some logistics that the committee is planning. The committee plans to get abstracts

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from hospitals via a randomized case selection.

- The group is planning to try to keep it to 15 members, but want a lot of different representation.
- They are planning for a January 2019 meeting to look at membership.

Illinois Perinatal Quality Collaborative Update (ILPQC) Update

- ILPQC recapped their annual conference.
 - They asked for feedback and some common ones they heard were: Continuing education wanted for physicians if possible, the cost of the conference can run high for certain organizations, and that the time of the conference is tough for downstate attendees.
 - ILPQC think the conference went well and had many compliments about the spirit and enthusiasm.
 - If there is any more feedback to let them know.
- They covered some of their 2018 accomplishments for their ongoing projects and their sustainability projects.
- Discussed policy issues they identified in 2018.
 - Discussed increase access to medication assisted treatment (MAT) and behavioral health for pregnant women with opioid use disorder. (OUD)
 - Support implementation of universal OUD screening for all pregnant women.
 - Discussed NARCAN reimbursement.
 - Discussed expanding reimbursement for universal post-partum visit and expand coverage up to one year.
- Gave an update on the mothers and newborns effected by opioid project.
 - For screening OUD and linkage to care the committee suggested that a goal should be set to aim for.
- Gave an update on the immediate post-partum long acting reversible contraception (IPLARC) project.
 - The test teams voted to talk about expanding IPLARC access across medicare and private insurance patients as the most wanted topic.
- Discussed improving post-partum access to care.
- Gave an update on the hypertension sustainability and golden hour projects.
- Gave an update on the golden hour sustainability project.
