What is a SHA and SHIP?

State Health Assessment or SHA:

Systematic approach to collecting, analyzing, and using data to educate and mobilize communities, develop priorities, garner resources, and plan actions to improve the public's health.

State Health Improvement Plan or SHIP:

Long-term systematic plan to address issues identified in the SHA. Describes how the state health department, the public health system and the communities it serves will work together to improve the health of the population.

SHIP Team Roles and Responsibilities

- **Pre-requisite for serving:**

- Complete the 3 annual trainings and paperwork for an appointment to a public Board.

- Review data and information and/or (in today's case) web meetings in advance of all meetings

- Actively participate in our meetings. As an appointed position, you are not able to send a designee in your place to meetings. 2020 includes:

- 2-3 recorded sessions
- 3 meetings

- Coordinate with your constituents, system partners and colleagues on implementation; champion the plan and changes.

2 Phases

Phase 1 Interim SHIP

- August – November 2020
- Coordinated 18-month plan to address urgent priorities in real-time


Phase 2 Comprehensive SHA/ SHIP

- January 2021 – June 2022
- 5-year comprehensive equity-driven plan with regional data and systems level transformation


Data Collection in Phase 1

- Review and analysis of all **Local Health Department (LHD) IPLANs**
 - What are the local community priorities selected?
 - How are communities addressing the priorities?
- Review and analysis of existing data and reports on **health topics, health status and behavioral risk factors at the state level**
- **Survey data** from LHDs and IDPH Staff and Board of Health on:
 - Public health issues and priorities
 - COVID19 – looking back and looking forward
 - Racism
 - Public health system strengths and weaknesses
- **Focus Groups** to dig deeper into the issues above with stakeholder groups: Emergency Managers, Hospitals, Coalitions addressing past SHIP priorities, Local Health Departments and Equity Leaders







2020 SHIP Team Meetings

Current/Future State

October 16th

10:30 AM - 12:00 PM

- **PRE-MEETING ACTIVITY**: Intro to SHIP Webinar and Data Webinar
- Review current population health status data
- Share perspectives from survey responses and focus group responses on Illinois priorities
- Discuss alignment of pop health status data with former priorities and current situations (e.g. equity, racism and Covid19 response)



**The Interim SHIP process is designed to update a portion of the data in the current SHIP and to meet as much of the SHIP law as possible. Will not meet everything in the law due to timeline.

Interim SHIP (update to 2016 SHIP)

- Review of existing LHD IPLANs
- Progress on 2016 SHIP Implementation
- Data on the existing 2016 SHIP Topical
- Domains 5 Virtual Focus Groups

Comprehensive SHA (beginning 2021)

Data Inputs

- Updated the 2016 Healthy Illinois Databook based on the identified indicators and SHIP Team selected emerging issues
- Forces of Change Assessment with the SHIP Team
- Assessment of the state's multi-sectoral public health system by the SHIP team and other stakeholders
- 15 focus groups on health concerns and well-being with organizations and stakeholders who provide services, and with people who are adversely affected by health equity and disparity issues, defined herein as a particular type of health difference that is closely linked with social, economic, and/or environmental disadvantage

Interim SHIP data will inform lay the foundation for data needed for the 2021/2022 SHA/SHIP process.

SHA/SHIP completed in 2021/2022 will inform annual updates to IDPH Strategic Plan, specifically, how and what the Dept will address from the SHIP.

Phase 1: Interim SHIP and IDPH Strategic Plan

- Description of impact of COVID-19 on all health issues to make the case for PH needing resources
- Identification of performance improvement priorities for IDPH and partners for COVID-19 to coordinate and collaborate going forward in a specific, targeted way
- Highlight the need to focus on equity in decision-making
- The foundation of a plan to address other major health issues in light of COVID19 ([see TFAH Report](#))
- Identification of key policy changes and needs for the next 18 months
- Stronger organizational alignment with IEMA/EMA, hospitals and public health
- Development of a leadership institute for action on equity
- Communication briefs from UIC for system partners to use based on the plan at all levels which gives locals shared talking points

Phase 2: Comprehensive SHA / SHIP

- An in-depth report on equity throughout the state
- Regional data
- Organized ACTION TEAMS that will work together to address priorities across the state
- A shared policy agenda across the state
- Coordinated advocacy for public health
