Action Plan Approach Discussion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Palmer: This is an opportunity for those that weren't part of the needs assessment to highlight any areas that we missed that should be considered ● Stewart: MCOs could help narrow down priorities by informing us on what they're doing in certain areas and who they are interacting with. ● Schubert: The final report should mention the priorities we did not choose, and why we selected the final priorities. ● Stewart: Can priorities be narrowed down by population? ● Manaster: Focusing on domains may not be effective. Families can cross multiple domains, creating difficulty in their lives and developing approaches to support them. ● Bennett: Taking a systems-based approach that focuses more on services, systems and infrastructure ensures that priorities don't just encompass one outcome. 	

Gaps in Activities Discussion	<p><i>Is there anything that's not on this list that you think is a gap?</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Schubert: Childhood obesity, but it could be covered by the Chronic Disease action team ● Jackson: Health risk behaviors for children and adolescents ● Handler: Health status is missing, make medical care homes available for women, children and families, as well as the definition of medical care homes ● Stewart: We need to address access to both health departments and MCOs 	
Current Activities/ Survey Results Discussion	<p><i>Thinking about the list of priority statements, which areas currently have activities in process?</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Schubert: Use past MCH application as a guide for services that are already happening. ● There is a lot on reporting healthy pregnancies ● Lux: Effects of the deteriorating funding and support of local health departments ● Stewart: Information sharing from the beginning ● Schubert: There's already ample work around priority 8. ● Stacy: We can't screen for mental health services, if we have no where to refer patients. ● Jackson: There is an increased need for service action in schools. ● McGowan: The behavioral health action team is focused on where investment can be made or where there is already existing funding, as well as prevention around women and newborns in the ICU.
