## Data Notes

- ❖ Total drug overdose deaths are defined as those in which drug poisoning (ICD-10 X40-X44, X60-X64, X85, Y10-Y14) was an underlying cause of the deaths.

Heroin-related drug overdose deaths are a subset of total drug overdoses in which heroin (ICD-10 T40.1) specifically was reported as being involved in the deaths.

- ❖ Causes of death are reported to the Department on death certificates by county coroners, medical examiners and physicians.
- ❖ “Final Data” are considered complete, having been reviewed and cleaned. “Provisional Data” are tabulated from records in the process of being reviewed and cleaned and where reporting may not be complete
- ❖ The provisional figures in these tables represent the death records in the Department's Illinois Vital Records System (IVRS) as of the report dates listed in the table. Drug overdose and heroin-related deaths are most likely underrepresented in more recent provisional data since some death investigations are still ongoing and causes of death not yet determined. The race/ethnicity category “NH Not yet coded” represents provisional records in which the race has not yet been processed and therefore determined.
- ❖ Estimated completion dates for finalizing provisional years are as follows:
  - Provisional 2015 made final by December 2016
  - Provisional 2016 made final by July 2017
