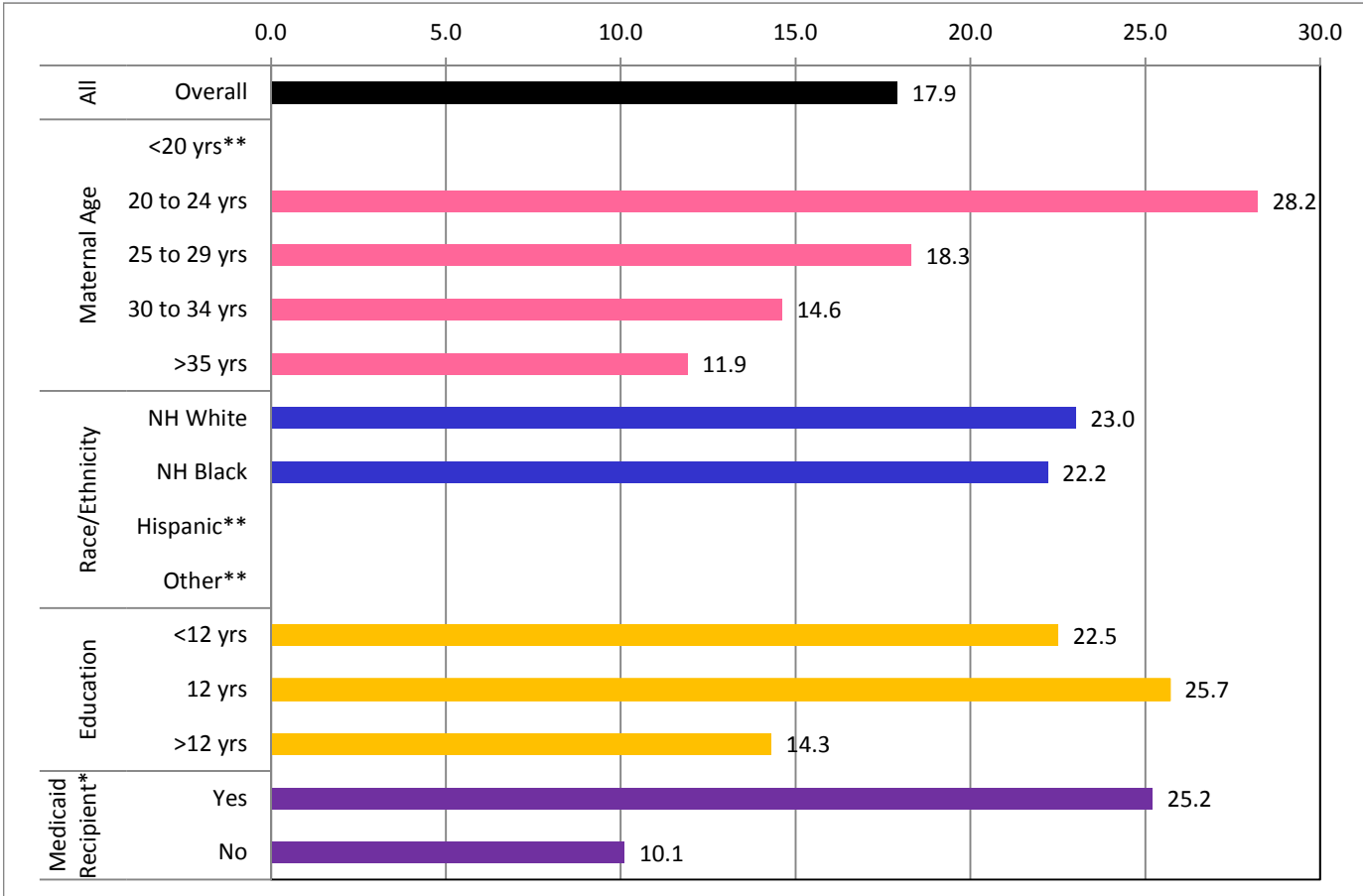


Smoking
