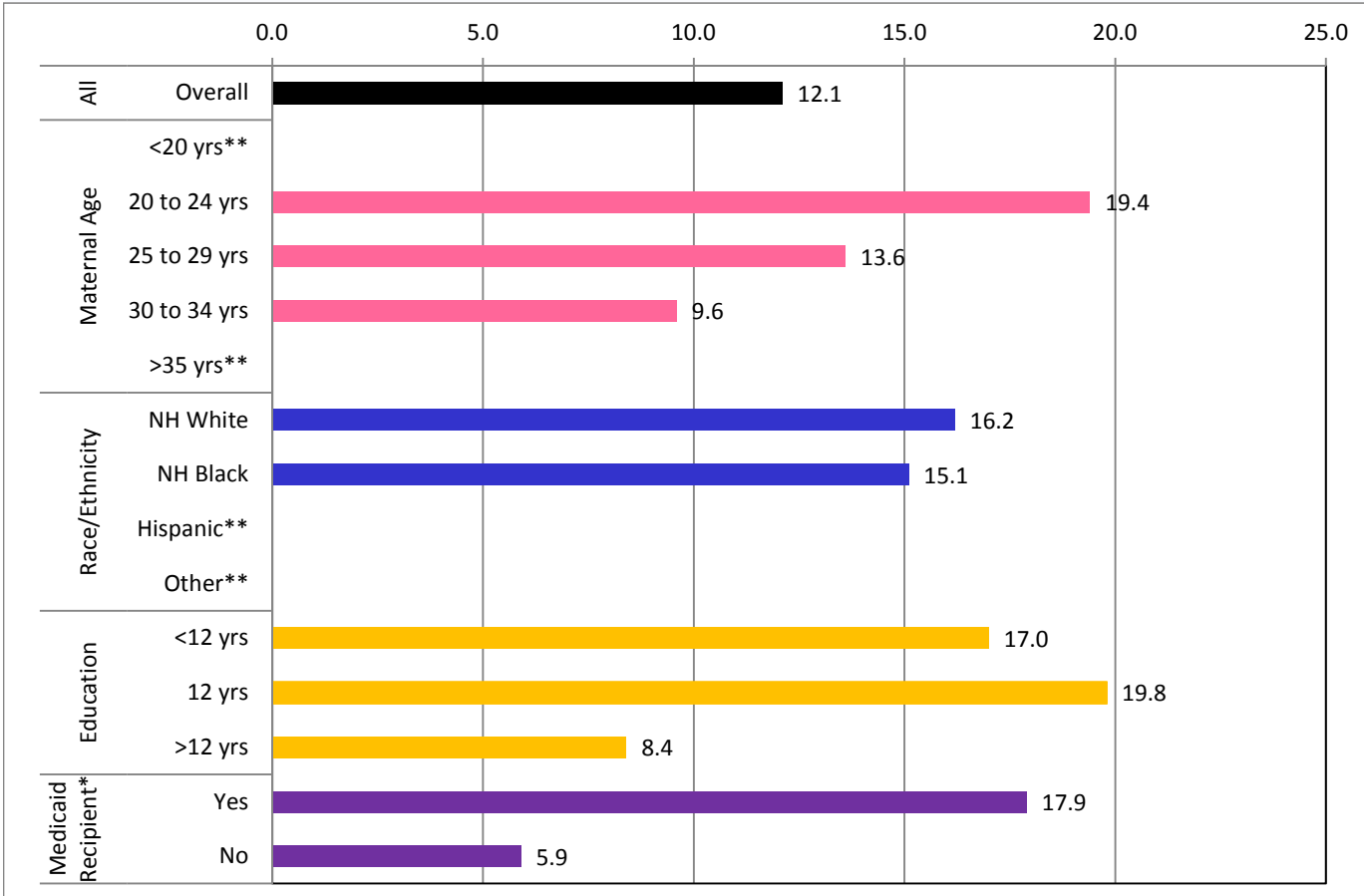


Smoking
