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## **Introduction**

This report is a compilation of data on health disparities presented in tables to monitor health disparities and progress made over time in Illinois. Disparity is defined as persons or groups not being equal in age, race, health, etc. According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (2016), disparities in health outcomes vary between demographic, social, economic, and geographic categories. The report can also be used for assessment of the State Health Improvement Plan (SHIP) and IDPH Strategic Priorities. These tables will be of use to many public health programs including minority health, rural health, disability and health, aging, emergency preparedness, and maternal and child health programs. These data can also be used by local health departments, community based organizations, legislators, and academics in planning, policy making, evaluation, and providing services. Twenty six tables are included in this report.

## **Data Sources and Methods**

Most of the data for the report came from the U.S. Census Bureau and the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH). We used data published on the websites or produced by different programs in the Illinois Department of Public Health. All tables include specific data sources.
