<p>5: Empower adolescents to adopt healthy behaviors.</p>	<p>1</p>	<p>Adolescent (and pre-adolescent) risk reduction, integrating state-funded efforts to prevent teen pregnancy and improve access to care (school health promotion and school-based health centers) (programs now at IDPH) with programs to prevent substance abuse and juvenile delinquency (programs at IDHS)</p>
